


Think about It

1 John 4:6

Taken out of context, John's statement could sound like the height of arrogance. We must view it, however, in the light several non-negotiable truths: 1) Jesus' words and deeds are vitally important and must be distinguished from all other systems of belief, and 2) in His grace and wisdom, God provided apostolic witnesses to ensure that those words and deeds would be communicated accurately to future generations. Given that, how could he say otherwise?
